Mrs. Brunson is the newly appointed President & Chief Executive Officer at N Street Village. This is the largest provider of women's services in the District of Columbia focused on trauma informed shelter and permanent supportive housing. Previously, Kenyatta was the Chief Program Officer at N Street Village. Here, she was responsible for overseeing program operations, program development, and program outcomes for N Street Village's ten residential programs. These have served over 700 women and 52 families. She also oversaw non-residential programs, which have served over 2,000 women each year. She directly supervised a program leadership team of eight employees and led a program department of nearly 100 FT and PT employees. Kenyatta, along with her team, ensured coordinated program delivery, quality control and program improvement, adherence to best clinical service practices, and team management and development.

She has been an outspoken advocate about women experiencing homelessness by being interviewed on Fox 5 News and ABC 4 News. The highlight of her career was being interviewed by Anderson Cooper on CNN when the Pope came to visit Washington, DC in 2015. At this time, the Pope visited with those individuals experiencing homelessness who were living in shelters operated by the Archdiocese of Washington. Mrs. Brunson had the privilege of being a featured speaker at the National Alliance to End Homelessness, National Conference for Individuals.

Mrs. Brunson has been awarded the Community Champion Award from Capital One Bank and was featured in Essence Magazine as the first runner up for the Hardest Black Woman Award. She was awarded the Empowering Woman Award from YWCA.

Kenyatta has a Bachelor of Science in Applied Psychology from Coppin State University and a Master of Science in Administration (MSA) in Nonprofit Management from Trinity Washington University. Kenyatta values family, so when she is not at the Village, she is making memories with her family.
